Labor and Union history

Labor Past:

Where did we come from?

- History shows there has been guilds, workers of crafts and trades although the years. In the 1700's guilds were different than what we have today but some of the same characteristics are still visible today in our modern unions.
- Same but greatly different. They were different because of the times and how labor was looked at. They did not have factories as we do today but they saw a need to set up their own organizations which maintained and defended their rights in the community.

Guild and Crafts were set up in three groups.

- 1. Master Craftsmen: Men who could set up their own shops and run them.
- 2. <u>Journeymen:</u> Men who worked for <u>Master Craftsmen</u>
- 3. <u>Apprentices:</u> who started at a young age, usually began at ten to fifteen years of age, and would live in the master craftsman's household. Most would serve an Apprenticeship of 7 years.

In the Ancient Guilds the **Master** and the <u>Journeymen</u> work together to protect their way of life and their craft.

They also did many things to protect their right to have a fair wage and better working conditions.

Many vast industrial groups of our modern industry would, for more profit will pit workers against workers and workers against owners as history will show later in this course.

What governors the International Union? <u>Constitution of the UAW</u>



It is updated at the Constitutional Convention ever 4 years 2014, 2018 etc.

This tells how the union is ran through a strict set of rules and guide lines.


Changes to the Constitution are made during the Constitutional Convention by proposals that go through a set process. Proposed amendments then presented to the delegates who approve them or not. If they pass the vote by official delegates they then become amendments.



The Local Union By Laws



By Laws are set guidelines to run each local union. Those too are changed by a vote of the membership of the local union when needed.

Covers agreements at the national level with **representatives** from all local unions sit on a counsel for this.


When we sit down to hammer out a new agreement it is done on the union side by: International Union Department Vice President.

What governors the local union and the company locally? <u>Local Agreement</u>



Covers agreements at the local level When we sit down to hammer out a new agreement it is done on the union side by:

International Rep
The Vice President
and local elected officials

Changes are made when the contact is up and we then negotiate a new National and Local agreement.

How does that happen?

Ideas:

- Ideas come from the floor and made in the written form as contract proposals National and the Local.
 - Union members submit written proposals to the union by a specified date. If they don't know where it is in the Contract leave it blank.
 - They are them complied into all one list just as written

Put in Order at a local level:

- They are then read at the union meeting.
- They are put in order as what is most important
- Example
 - 1.
 - 2.
 - 3.
- National items are put on a national list
- When the proposal are all read the local union must adopt them at the union meeting by Vote.

Send to the National UAW and GD Counsel:

Then the compiled list are sent to the counsel for the National master list for negotiations

- The people on the union side must work together with all the unions for the counsel.
- It is very important that the union have a game plan going in to get the most out negotiations.
- Know who you are dealing with
- What are their assets?
- Profit margins
- Contracts coming up.
- Future cost of health care
